### Organization Background

**About the Organization History for Establishment (Navachar Vision Foundation)**

Navachar Vision Foundation was formally established in August 2025 with the mission of empowering youth and building an inclusive development, resilient and sustainable society. The foundation was born out of a strong social vision, even before its founders knew each other personally.

Before the establishment of the organization, the two founding members — Mr. Basudeb Das and Mr. Suman Kumar Jaiswal — were not acquainted. During the time when Mr. Basudeb Das was working in Madhubani, he developed a deep concern for the situation of youth people in society. He strongly believed that real and lasting social change can only be achieved when youth work for youth and when youth people are actively involved in solving social problems.

He envisioned a society where there would be no discrimination, where people would support one another, and where individuals from all communities would feel safe, confident, and empowered. His vision included working across multiple critical sectors such as environmental protection, disaster risk reduction, education, health and livelihood development. He believed that progress in these areas was essential for building strong and resilient communities.

To turn this vision into reality, it was necessary to bring youth people onto a common platform where they could collaborate, learn and contribute meaningfully to society. During this journey, in March 2024, Mr. Basudeb Das met Mr. Suman Kumar Jaiswal, a resident of Begusarai. Very soon, both realized that they shared similar dreams, values and social commitments. Their thoughts aligned on the importance of youth leadership, community service and grassroots development.

As Mr. Basudeb Das learned more about the social conditions in Begusarai, he felt that the district urgently needed focused youth-driven interventions. Many young people in the area were becoming vulnerable to wrong influences such as substance abuse, criminal activities, theft and other antisocial behavior. The lack of guidance, opportunities and positive engagement was pushing youth away from constructive paths. Both founders strongly felt that these young people needed proper direction, motivation and opportunities to contribute positively to society.

Recognizing this urgent need, Mr. Basudeb Das made the significant decision to relocate from Madhubani to Begusarai so that the organization could be built directly within the community that required immediate support. Together, the founders decided to establish the organization in Begusarai and work at the grassroots level with local youth.

They named the organization “Navachar”, a Hindi word meaning innovation — to do something new or to apply new methods to improve existing systems and practices. The name reflects their belief that social problems require creative, practical and community-based solutions.

With this vision, the founders committed themselves to mobilizing youth, nurturing leadership skills and promoting community participation in development initiatives. To ensure strong governance, transparency, and public trust, they decided to register the organization under the Section 8 Company Act, which is specifically designed for non-profit organizations working for social welfare. This legal structure was chosen to enhance the organization's credibility, accountability and visibility, and to ensure that all resources are used strictly for charitable and developmental purposes.

After completing all legal and administrative procedures, Navachar Vision Foundation was successfully registered in August 2025, marking the formal beginning of its journey. Since its inception, the foundation has aimed to serve as a platform where youth people can grow as responsible citizens, social leaders, and change-makers, contributing actively to the development of a just, inclusive and sustainable society.

8. To promote social inclusion by encouraging harmony, gender equality, and participation of all communities.
9. To build leadership capacity among young people through volunteering, training, and civic engagement initiatives.
